Do you want to take the next step in your career? International Business Part-time is hands-on, allowing you to apply theory and practice to your work. Study in the evening and earn a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration.

THE PROGRAMME

International Business is a four-year bachelor's degree programme, taught entirely in English. Your evening classes consist of lectures, group work and self-study. The first year starts with 8 modules, including Principles of Economics, Business English, and Ethics, Responsibility and Sustainability. You will create a self-reflection report, and along with your team, design and present a corporate plan.

In your second year you will follow 10 modules including Cross-Cultural Analysis, Management Accounting and International Commercial Law. In groups, you will undertake a research project sponsored by a company and conduct a year-long international expansion analysis. In your third year you will follow a minor and a in-company internship. In the final year you will take your final 8 modules, and complete your studies by writing a graduation paper for the company in which you are employed.

"I wanted to pursue higher education next to my work, so my only option was to study part-time. The pace of the programme was demanding at times, and balancing work and study required careful planning, and sometimes it was necessary to make compromises in my social life as well. Luckily my employer was flexible with my working hours, allowing me to find a good balance."

I chose to study International Business at AMSIB because the programme was offered in English, offered part-time and in Amsterdam. I never felt that the quality of education had been compromised by following it part-time. In fact, it gave me a holistic understanding of the business environment, increased my academic knowledge and improved my soft skills."

Study load

- ▶ The number of contact hours per week in the first year of the programme is 6 hours. Contact hours include: 50-minute teaching hours, tutorials, over-seeing projects and any other online/offline contact between the lecturer and the student.
- ▶ Approx. 14-20 hours per week, are spent on (online/offline) projects, research, self-study without the presence of a lecturer or supervisor. You will spend a significant number of these hours at your workplace.
- ▶ Each academic year, you can earn 60 credits. If you earn less than 50 credits, AUAS will issue you a negative binding study advice (BSA). This means you will not be able to continue the programme.

Admission requirements

- ▶ Dutch diplomas: all VWO and HAVO profiles with the addition of one of the 5 subjects Mathematics A or B, or Economics, or M&O, or Business Economics are accepted. MBO 4 is also accepted.
- ▶ International diplomas: We require evidence that you have passed the standardised examinations for university entrance of your nation of origin. Read more here: www.nuffic.nl/en/diploma-recognition.
- ▶ We expect good written and verbal skills in English.
