MODULES

- Module 1 Applying occupational therapy and occupational science research and theory to practice (UK)
- Module 2 Qualitative research in relation to human occupation - critical reflections on methods and researcher positionality (NL)
- Module 3 Applying and reflecting on quantitative research methods in relation to human occupation (CH)
- Module 4 Socio-cultural perspectives of human occupation - Scientific and theoretical argumentation (ES)
- ► Module 5 Designing and planning a research project in relation to human occupation (SE)
- ► Module 6 Conducting a research project in relation to human occupation

STUDY LOAD

For modules 1 to 4:

- Preparatory work: 56 hours over two weeks, in the home country
- Classwork: 80 hours over two weeks, at hosting institutions
- ➤ Assignment: 200 hours over 8 weeks, in the home county

Modules 5 and 6 have a different structure with more self-study and online support, leading to a research thesis.
